Maggie Lump is a Registered Veterinary Technician and a Certified Pet First Aid instructor through the American Safety and Health Institute. She has over ten years experience in the veterinary field, with the past four years in emergency and critical care. Maggie is a member of the Veterinary Medical Assistance Teams which provide animal medical support during national disasters. She has participated in the PetMassage program, and currently provides rehabilitation services at Pet Med Spa and Rehabilitation Center in West Lafayette, IN.

Pet First Aid and CPR is a 3-hour course. You will learn the skills and knowledge necessary to provide emergency care to a dog or cat in a safe manner, while also reducing pain, and minimizing the consequences of injury or sudden illness until veterinary help is received.

This program is geared towards anyone who owns or works in an occupation that involves animals. Lessons include how to safely handle an injured or ill pet, perform CPR, recognize breathing emergencies, control bleeding, and much more. Presentation methods incorporate real-life scenarios using video, hands-on practice, lecture and instructor-led discussion. All participants receive a handbook for future reference, as well as a certificate of completion.

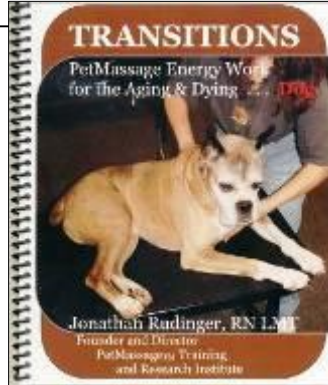

LEGISLATIVE NEWS

The following was provided by Barb Richter IAAMB member from CO:

Colorado recently passed House Bill 1042 pertaining to Equine Massage. The bill removes equine massage from the veterinary practice law but requires that all practitioners must be certified by a school/program accredited by the Colo. Dept. of Education. The law goes into effect Jan. 1 , 2010. There is no clause to grandfather practicing therapists and I am unaware of any programs that we previously accredited so it seems that many (all?) therapists practicing in Colorado will have to go back to school. Its unclear how this will work. Thought you should know.

Trying to pass law 316 in Indiana to make alternative medicine only for licensed veterinarians! How many DVM's are going to do that? FEW, very few. We must get this message out to everyone to get this voted down!

Announcement: National Certification for Animal Massage & Acupressure

The time has come for Acupressure and Massage to take their rightful place among the Nationally Certified professions. The process has begun and will be a reality in the near future.

As of late spring 2008, the Equine Massage and Acupressure National Certification Examinations will be available through Hocking College which is hosting these online examinations. There will be many more details regarding this momentous process as the time gets closer to going live.

Late last summer, Nancy Zidonis and Amy Snow, founders of Tallgrass Animal Acupressure Institute, met with Hocking College, a leader in the field of Equine Health Care, to launch the process of creating National Certification Examinations for massage and acupressure. Tallgrass instructors are Adjunct Faculty at Hocking College, which has had an Equine Sciences program for over 20 years. Additionally, Hocking is known for their two-year Equine Health Care & Complementary Therapies Associates Degree program.

The next step was to gather a core team of massage and acupressure professionals with whom to work on the project. The first task was to develop a Scope of Practice for each of the disciplines. Over the next months, Theresa Gagnon of the Bancroft School of Massage Therapy as head of the massage examination worked with Tina Romine and Bill Harnetty, DVM of Hocking College, Lola Michelin of the Northwest School of Animal Massage, Elaine Calenda and Barbara Maciejewski of the Boulder College of Massage in the process of developing the examinations for national certification.

Though this process has begun with equine massage and acupressure, we expect to have to have a canine examination in place by fall of 2008. The canine massage and acupressure program at Hocking College is scheduled to begin this summer.

This is the beginning of establishing these complementary therapies as a recognized career path. We have to begin somewhere and this is where we are. These initial steps toward national certification are similar to the "Good Housekeeping Seal of Approval" – it is a professional standard that the public and veterinary community can trust. By having this credential, the practitioner in animal massage and/or acupressure we are saying that the top professionals in the field consider you equally capable of providing this scope of service.



Working With Fearful, Anxious, or
Reactive Dogs: The TTouch
Approach Presented by
Kathy Cascade, PT, Tellington
TTouch Instructor

Dealing with fearful, reactive, or aggressive behavior issues is certainly challenging and often dangerous. Unfortunately, these behaviors are often worsened by training techniques and handling that intensify a dog's fear and anxiety.

Based on her experience of working with numerous dogs who exhibit these often frustrating behaviors, Kathy will describe how to use the Tellington TTouch Method to reduce stress and build confidence in both dogs and their people. The goal is to give the dog a new experience of feeling safe, relaxed, and in control while in a challenging environment or in the presence of new people, which previously would have elicited a fearful response. Kathy describes this process as "building trust one experience at a time."

Topics to be covered include:

- Reading body language and calming signals correctly.
- Understanding the relationship between posture, balance, and behavior.



- The importance of observation and recognition of tension patterns.
- How to make a non-threatening approach to a dog exhibiting signs of stress.
- The use of TTouch bodywork to reduce muscle tension and physiological arousal.
- Mechanics of TTouch: Variety of touch, tempo, pressure, mindfulness.
- Other TTouch tools to give new sensory information: Body wraps and the wand.
- Working with dogs who exhibit extreme fearful or reactive responses to people.

Kathy has a keen interest in neurophysiology and the role of stress and traumatic experiences on health and behavior, and has completed post graduate training in Biofeedback, Sensory Integration, Myofascial Release, and Cranial Sacral Therapy. Kathy's introduction to Tellington TTouch Training began in 1994. Searching for a truly respectful and gentle approach to working with animals, she attended her first TTouch workshop for companion animals with Linda Tellington-Jones. The work resonated so much with Kathy that she went on to complete the first two-year TTouch Practitioner Certification Program, graduating in October 1996. Kathy has since become an instructor in the program and has shared her creative and humorous teaching style in TTouch Trainings and workshops throughout the United States, in Canada, and Europe. Her compassionate and skillful approach to working with dogs with aggression issues has been a tremendous help to many people.
